Introduction

This policy outlines the purpose, nature and management of uniform and appearance expectations at Gulf British Academy.

All members of staff will be provided with a copy of this policy and it is the responsibility of all members of staff to make sure the policy is adhered to and enforced.

Aims and purposes

- To maintain a consistent approach and expectation of appearance among pupils.
- To ensure that pupils of Gulf British Academy represent the school in an appropriate and respectful manner.
- To sustain a clear level of appropriate behavior in line with the school's Behavior Management Policy and the guidelines and laws for the Ministry of Education for Kuwait.

The Uniforms

For all pupils, there are two uniforms; one for academic classes and another for P.E. classes. Pupils must wear their P.E. uniform to school on the days when they have P.E.

Parents are advised to add/sew their child's name on their clothing.

School uniforms are available from the uniform shop, which is open from 07:15 to 14:00.

Compliance and enforcement

GBA believes that a uniform is an integral part of a safe and effective school environment, and that modesty is something that should be modelled by all.

The responsibilities for upholding and maintaining our dress code lie with class teachers and the leadership team. The following must be adhered to:

- All pupils are required to wear the school uniform unless the school authorises special 'non-uniform' days.
- Jewellery will not be allowed for boys, but girls may have studs in their ears.
- Make-up and nail polish in school is not allowed.
- A wristwatch may be worn.
- Long hair for girls must be neatly tied back. For boys, haircuts are to be short and tidy.

Failure to wear the correct uniform

Pupils who fail to wear the correct uniform can be referred through the Behavior Management Policy of the school.

- In the first few instances, the class teacher must use the behaviour chart and inform parents over persistent infractions of school uniform.
- If this persists, the matter will be referred to the Senior Leadership Team to resolve the issue directly with parents.
